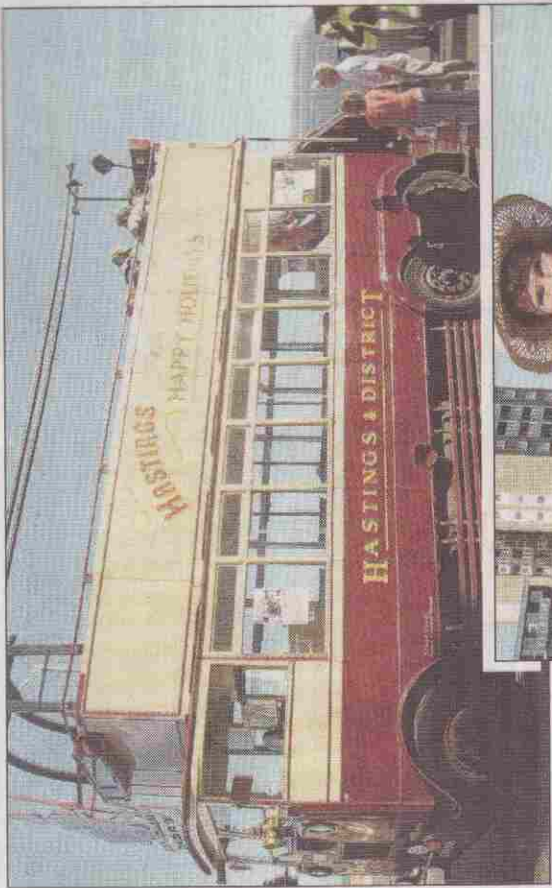


Seafront trip down Memory Lane
